


Admission.

Our history.

Over a quarter century ago, the VCU Health System Child Care Center became one of the first employer sponsored on-

site child care centers in Virginia. It has established a rich tradition of commitment to quality of care for children and families, and serving to assist employees with the challenges of work-life balance.

Our child care program has contributed to the distinctive achievements of the VCU Health System, including: recognition as the Greater Richmond Employer of Choice; Working Mother's 100 Best Companies for Working Mothers; the National Association for Women Executives for the advancement of women; and The Center for Companies that Care for creating a nurturing environment for employees and one that encourages community involvement.

A unique approach.

Located in the center of downtown Richmond, the children are surrounded by opportunities to interact daily with diverse cultures. A beautiful learning garden provides a play yard rich with experiences that nurture the spirit as well as the physical development of each child.

Being a part of the Virginia Commonwealth University our school has unique access to professionals from many different disciplines. The center staff are educated in the fields of education, growth and development and family counseling. Through active research and continuing education opportunities our teachers remain current in educational theory and best practices for children, as well as new approaches to learning.

The VCUHS Child Care Center offers a continuum of care beginning with infancy and extending through the preschool years. This provides the opportunity to develop long term relationships and establish trust so essential to balancing the complexities of work and family life. Our program is based on proven child development and education theories. Children in our program are encouraged to establish a sense of trust and self-esteem as they learn more about themselves and the world around them. They are also encouraged to explore their individual potentials in unique learning centers, which focus on arts and crafts, music and movement, reading readiness, math readiness, fine and gross motor development, science and role play. Self-paced activities provide a positive framework for appropriate development. Our program is enhanced through field trips, Theater IV plays and "special interest" visitors.

Our intergenerational program provides magnificent opportunities to blend the wonder of the infant and young child with the wisdom of our adult neighbors.

A welcome advantage.

Our program is inspired by the schools of Reggio Emilio in Italy (named by US News and World Report as one of the top 10 preschools in the world). Our visit there left us with a deeper understanding of the natural passion for learning that children possess; a deeper appreciation for each child's competence; and their ability to be cocreators of knowledge and understanding. The Reggio philosophy maintains that teachers are not givers of knowledge and children vessels to be filled. Rather, teachers and children are partners in learning and by careful observation and planning the teacher facilitates learning based on the child's interests. Our program believes in open visitation. We encourage parents to take advantage of the opportunity to nurse their infants (whether on schedule or demand), share lunch, plan a picnic, participate in special events/activities or just stop by to say

hello! What's more, *Child Magazine* has cited uninterrupted quality time with your child as one of the advantages of a daily commute together!

Insuring quality care.

Distinctly, our program is among only 8 percent in the United States to be accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children. (NAEYC). Appropriate teacher/child ratios are critical to the provision of quality care and individualized attention. Our teacher:child ratios are: infants (6 weeks to 12 months) 1:4; pre-toddlers (12 –17 months) 1:4; Jr. toddlers (17 months-2 years) 1:5; toddlers (2-3 years) 1:6; preschool (3-6 years) 1:10; and summer camp (6 –12 years) 1:11.

Convenience counts.

We recognize that balancing a busy personal and professional life can be very challenging. To assist you in creating this balance, the following items are provided for your child: standard formulas, soybean formulas, baby foods, juices and table foods, disposable diapers, 3 meals/day and 3 snacks (based on hours of attendance).

Crucial opportunities.

We view parents as our partners and maintain an open door policy. Ongoing communication is an essential component of our program. Parents are invited to share thoughts, ideas and reflections. Special events, parent meetings and educational seminars also encourage a healthy exchange.

Additional services.

Based on space availability, we provide back-up child care for employees whose children are not enrolled. Summer camp, snow day and winter/spring break options also exist. We also have contracted with an agency to provide in-home and community-based sick child care as needed.
